These acknowledgements will be filed on the Friends of Kuranda Region website for our community to access.

Our community does not accept the Queensland Government's 'planning from afar' or 'coordinated project' as an excuse for not understanding the – not potential impact – but actual impact of a project of this nature in the middle of the Kuranda Envirolink Wildlife Corridor.

There are no 'best practises' possible for urban subdivision on this land.

The KUR-World project area is located centrally in Kuranda on high land in 100% catchment for our endangered species habitats, on creeks that empty to the Barron River, and onto the World Heritage Great Barrier Reef. Clearing 45-75 years old Recovering Rainforest in Cassowary Essential Habitat, scraping back the dirt, damming the creeks and catchments, *importing 1000 new residents* who have no appreciation of their environmental impacts is plain stupidity in the World Heritage Wet Tropics Vital Corridors.

Our community understands our right to Social License of the KUR-World project. The private sale of 12 HISTORICALLY ZONED RURAL TITLES does not entitle ANY OWNER to live out their fantasy in the middle of our quiet village without ANY CONSULTATION. We find this totally unacceptable.

As custodians of this place, we do not accept the *urbanisation* or *gentrification* of our Kuranda Region on the grounds on *Matters of National Environmental Significance*. RURAL TITLES in the Kuranda Region must never be subdivided for urban subdivision for the sake of *private profits*, instead the land should remain as RURAL and purchased by an appropriate owner to use the land for its current zoning.
