Council concluded its engagement on this project last year. The work is planned and will progress as ground conditions from the recent wet weather events and contractor availability permits. The fountain will be removed and not replaced.

Hope you had a lovely weekend - saw you on Facebook at the Netball season kick off yesterday :-)

Thank you for your reply.

I know that coming into the community consultation it was council's preferred option to remove the fountain. It's been broken and derelict for many years and now an eyesore and the costs to repair and then maintain is not something that council is interested in - I understand that.

I would like to ask you if you would consider leaving the vertical rocks in place - we can still plant that out with pretty native vegetation - see sample below - which will survive without running water.

The option put forward for the big rocks when they are removed was to 'scatter' them around the park under the trees - not to actually remove them which would be a logistical nightmare. So my proposal now is the remove the pond, water and electricity but leave the vertical rock wall so it can be planted out and made into a feature of the botanical garden. The real upside for this option is we will be able to put more plant species on there for the botanical garden which will make it even more interesting:-)

This is an excellent compromise Angela - and I know we have Kuranda Conservation's (Jax) backing to plant it out. We will get started as soon as the pond is removed.

Kuranda Envirocare (Cathy) have some funds left over on a grant and have offered to get the first round of plant ID's printed and installed :-)
